As such, students need to work harder, and parents need to upgrade their supervision so that the damage can be reversed.

Although attendance at school is one of the prerequisites for getting good grades, yet what students do after school in their own time is also very important. Just attending school and the tuition classes is not enough. If that were so, then every student would do well just by being physically present in class. What matters is what students do after school and after tuition classes. For a subject like mathematics which is often perceived as difficult by most students, rigorous practice is essential. A lot of mathematics is dependent on intuition, i.e., which theorem or which property or which formula to apply to a problem. This intuition is built only through solving a large number of problems.

Make no mistake, academic achievers are no miracles. The Nobel laureate Richard Feynman

famously said, "I was an ordinary person who studied hard. There's no miracle people." Success just requires persistent hard work.

I wish you the best for the rest of the academic session.

Santiniketan, West Bengal has been inscribed on UNESCO's list of World Heritage Sites during the 45th session of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

Santiniketan is India's 41st UNESCO World Heritage Site.





It is an ensemble of historic buildings, landscapes and gardens, pavilions, artworks, and continuing educational and cultural traditions that together express its Outstanding Universal Value.

Established in rural West Bengal in 1901, Santiniketan was founded by Rabindranath Tagore, a renowned poet and philosopher.

The built and open spaces of Santiniketan constitute an exceptional global testimony to ideas of environmental art and educational reform where progressive education and visual art are intertwined with architecture and landscape, with the Ashram, Uttarayan, and Kala-Bhavana areas forming the prime sites of these practices.

Santiniketan is also directly and tangibly associated with the ideas, works, and vision of Rabindranath Tagore and his associates, pioneers of the Bengal School of Art and early Indian Modernism.

This UNESCO recognition not only celebrates India's heritage but also reinforces the global significance of Santiniketan as a cultural and educational beacon.

The World Heritage Convention, adopted by UNESCO in 1972, strives to safeguard such exceptional places for future generations, recognizing their universal value and the need for international cooperation in their protection.




Every Saturday, the Khoai region around Sonajhuri forests transmutes into a blend of colours and melody. The weekly haat or bazaar here is a paradise for shopaholics, art and music lovers. Ethnic jewelry, hand-woven and batik sarees, dresses, bags, woodwork, folk instruments, and traditional toys meld with Baul gaan to create an indelible atmosphere.

It is also called "Shonibaar'er haat". All the local artisans gather at this place called Khoai, in Shonajhuri. Everything that you would find here is handmade, right from clothing to accessories, furniture, decoratives, etc. This "mela" or fair starts at around 3:00-3:30 PM IST on every Saturday and lasts till there's daylight. There is no power supply, hence, by the time it's dusk, the sellers will wind up their stuff. It is a must-visit place if you are in Shantiniketan!


